Local Non-Profit Spotlight: Bethany House

Bethany House provides short-term housing and life advancement services to women and children escaping domestic violence. Women and their families are provided safe, restorative, and trauma-informed care along with temporary housing, support, and resources needed to transition into independent lives free from abuse. Bethany House continues to provide counseling and life advancement programming for up to two years after transitioning clients into permanent housing.

JLNV Lends a Hand: Professional Development Workshops

Community Council partnered with Bethany House on May 13 to host a professional development day for their clients. JLNV members led three workshops on Workforce Skills, Financial Literacy, and Public Speaking. JLNV also provided breakfast, lunch, and child care during the day. Bethany House, participating clients, and JLNV members were thrilled with the experience. Community council plans to host more sessions with Bethany House and other organizations throughout the next league year.

Year-End Stats

From June 2022 through May 2023, members worked with 15 different community partners to implement KITK and PA programming, prep and donate food, and support the community.





Volunteer Shifts and Hours

From June 2022 through May 2023, Junior League members donated 833 hours though 339 event shifts to 15 community partners.
